Standard Rules Process (SRP) to develop Clinical Practice **Guidelines (CPG) or Position Statements (PS) of EFIM**



Grades of recommendation

Methods and **Process for** EFIM CPG

Aim and Scope of **EFIM CPG**

Description of the criteria and rules for EFIM CPG panellists

- To harmonise the procedure of developing and implementing reliable, evidencebased and up-to-date CPG or PS of EFIM according to international standards for CPG established by the Guidelines international network (www.g-i-n.net)
- To advance methodology, transparency and science, but preserving at the same time practicability

Standard Rules Process for CPG and PS

(Max Duration: 62 Weeks)



Topic selected by EFIM EC (proposals by WGs, Nat Soc) Invite Chair(s) of CPG panel & collect COI (1 week)

Discuss (EC & Chair) panel composition (8-12 panel members-not exclusively from WGs; 2 weeks)

→ Invite CPG panel members & collect COI (2 weeks)

Draft 15–25 specific PICO questions (CPG panel members, 12 weeks)

Constitute 20-30 Delphi panel members (in parallel, 4 weeks)*

First Delphi round:
Validate PICO
questions (>75%
agreement needed)
(4 weeks)

Unbiased literature search & draft recommendations (24 weeks)

Second Delphi round: Vote on recommendations (4 weeks)

Revise, edit & finalize recommendations & manuscript (6 weeks)

Review: 3 EFIM EC members & 3 external reviewers (3 weeks) Approval of final revision by EFIM EC (3 weeks)

Presentation at ECIM & publication in EJIM without additional review

*Nomination by EFIM EC in consultation with CPG Chair(s), National Societies and Patient Associations Note: Position Statements (PS) follow the same steps but do NOT include Delphi rounds – internal voting is conducted instead. For more details see the document at EFIM website.


