


Postgraduate Survey of European Internal Medicine Training

- Questionnaire sent to European Internal Medicine societies. by European Board of Internal Medicine.
- There were 209 responses from 37 countries
- 100 questions asked with a completion rate of 71%.
- 65% of respondents had completed Internal Medicine training (35% in training).
- Range of areas asked included hospital structure, education, assessment, certification, CPD and handover.
- Also specific questions on career, supervision and burnout.
- Clarification of how trainees gain their national accreditation for Internal Medicine and how they are assessed.


Training in Internal Medicine

- 78% train for 5 years to be a specialist in Internal Medicine.
- 68% state it is possible to train in more than one specialty apart from Internal Medicine.
- 71% have a choice with the selection of training of rotation programmes
- 78% have an electronic medical health care record system.
- 65% have a medical short stay unit.
- 91% have specific Internal Medicine wards

How long on average after graduation do you enter specialty training in Internal Medicine?






45% enter training for Internal Medicine on graduation.

Accreditation and assessment

- Final certification awarded by Ministry of Health in 51% and also responsible for issuing a license to practice in 52% of residents.
- After certification, 77% have no restrictions on practice as a specialist.
- 21% have to re-certificate after a fixed period of time.

Career Expectations

- 76% thought Internal Medicine met their career expectations.
- 49% feel 'burned out' to some extent.
- 69% feel supported by colleagues.
- · 60% feel valued in their current job.
- 72% feel intellectually stimulated in their rôle.
- ♦ Most training programmes in Internal Medicine are 5 years in length.
- Rotations through Intensive Care and Cardiology are usually mandatory
- ♦ Most must pass a final exam to become an Internal Medicine specialist in their country
- Internal Medicine offers a supported, valued and stimulating professional career option within an environment where intensity can be high and burn out is possible.

EBIM survey interim results

- 209 responses
- 72% completion rate
- Average 29 minutes to complete



- To generate questions for the European exam in Internal Medicine as directed by the Examining Board of EBIM.
- To participate in QWG meetings, which are held at least once a year and more frequently as required.
- To participate in training as required.

Responsibilities and duties of Question Writers

Requirements

- Hold a diploma in internal medicine recognized by their National Authority
- up to date with the appraisal process of internal medicine in their country.
- actively engaged in the training of junior doctors within the last five years
- up-to-date as appropriate with the European Curriculum in Internal Medicine, relevant National and European Guidelines, and their national CPD and CME requirements.
- To keep abreast of developments in the world of medical education and medical practice.
