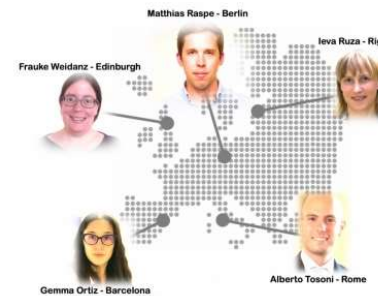

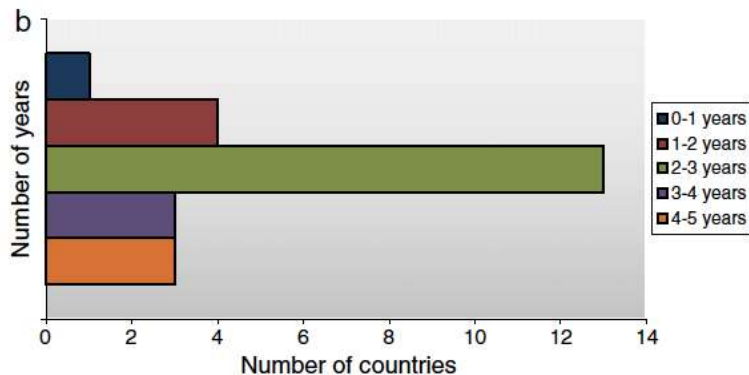
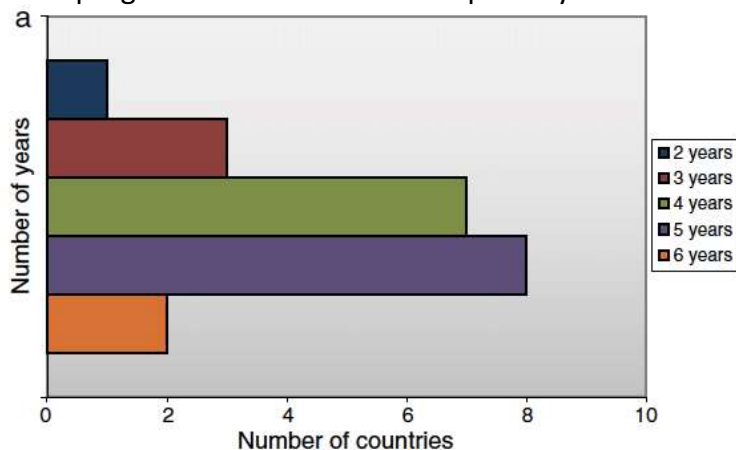

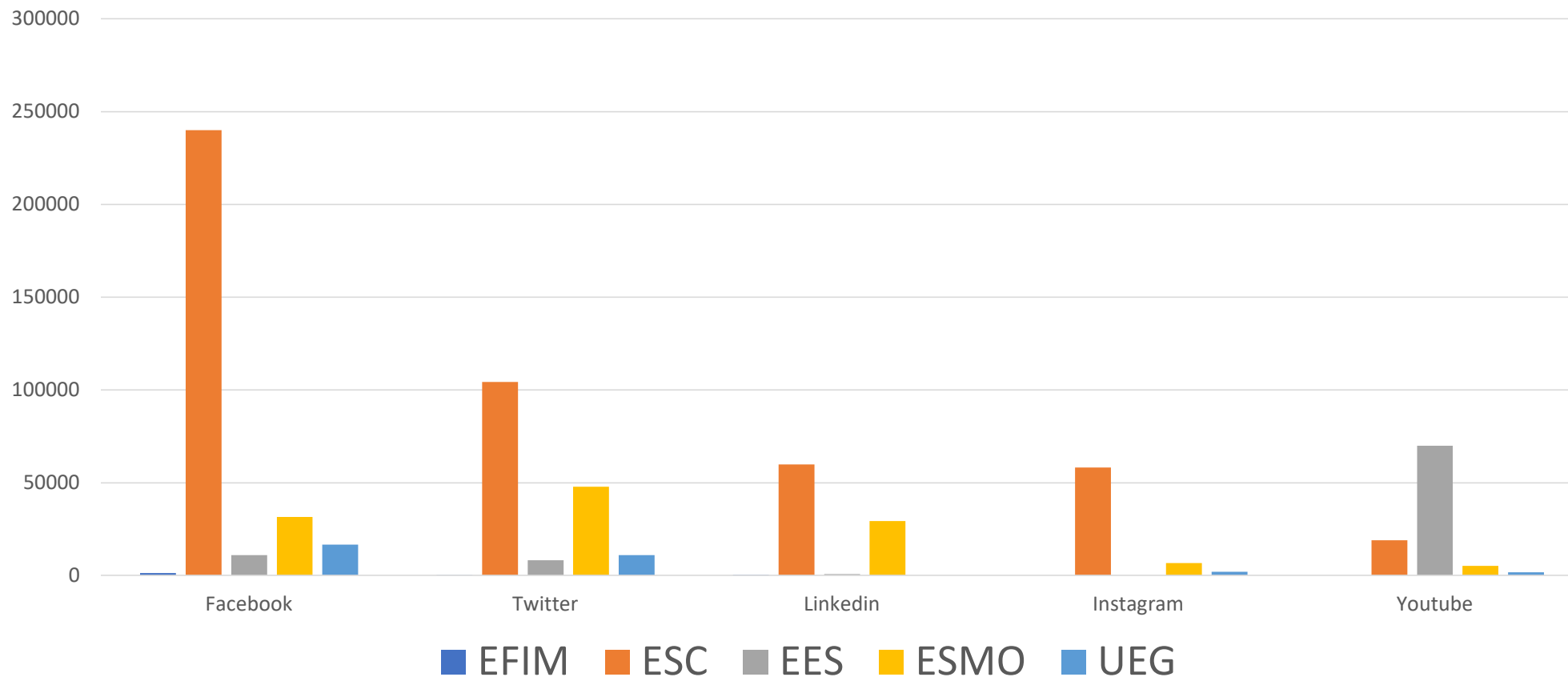

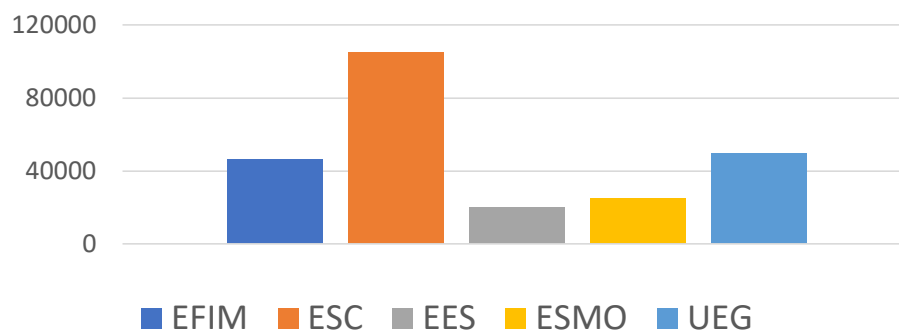
Social media presence of European Medical Societies



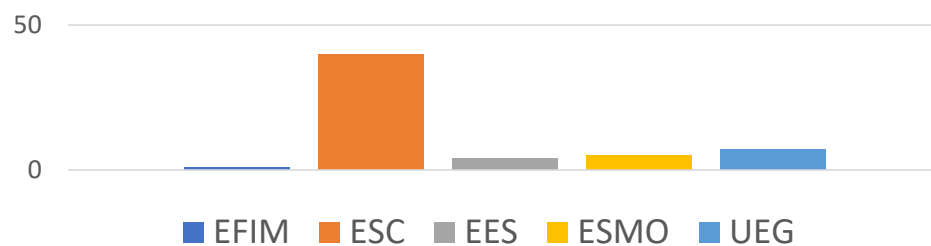
Number of followers, 1st March 2021

Comparative of European Medical Societies

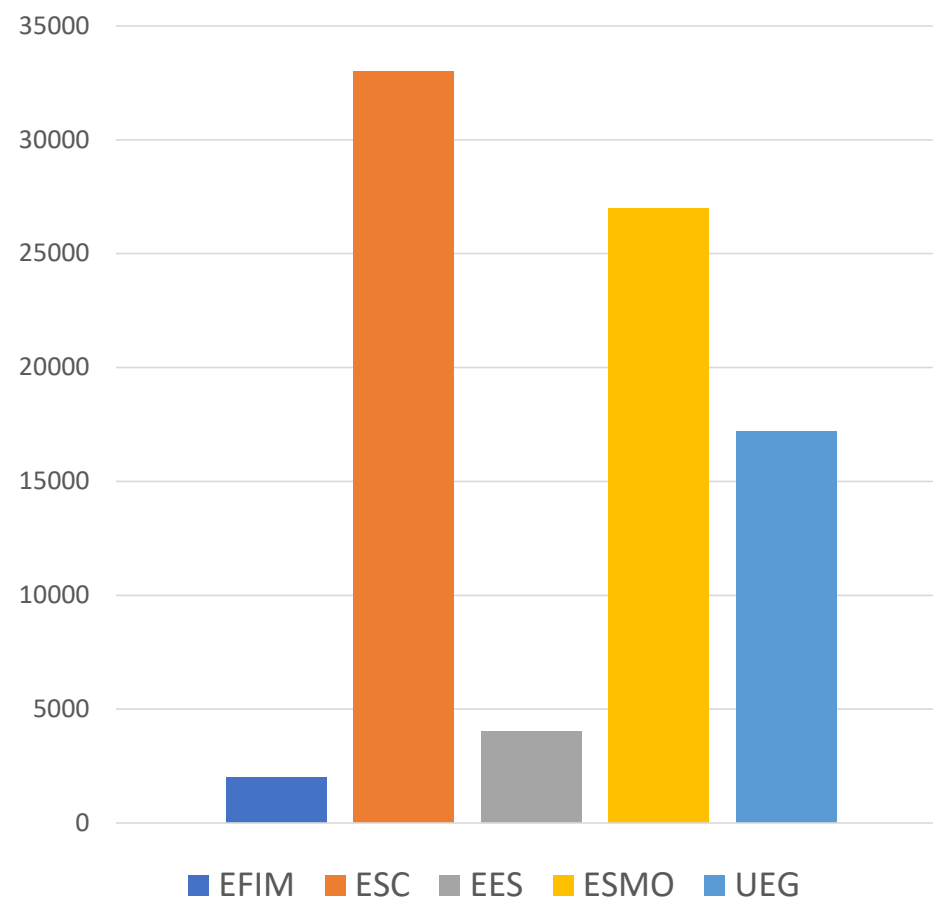
Number of members (2020)

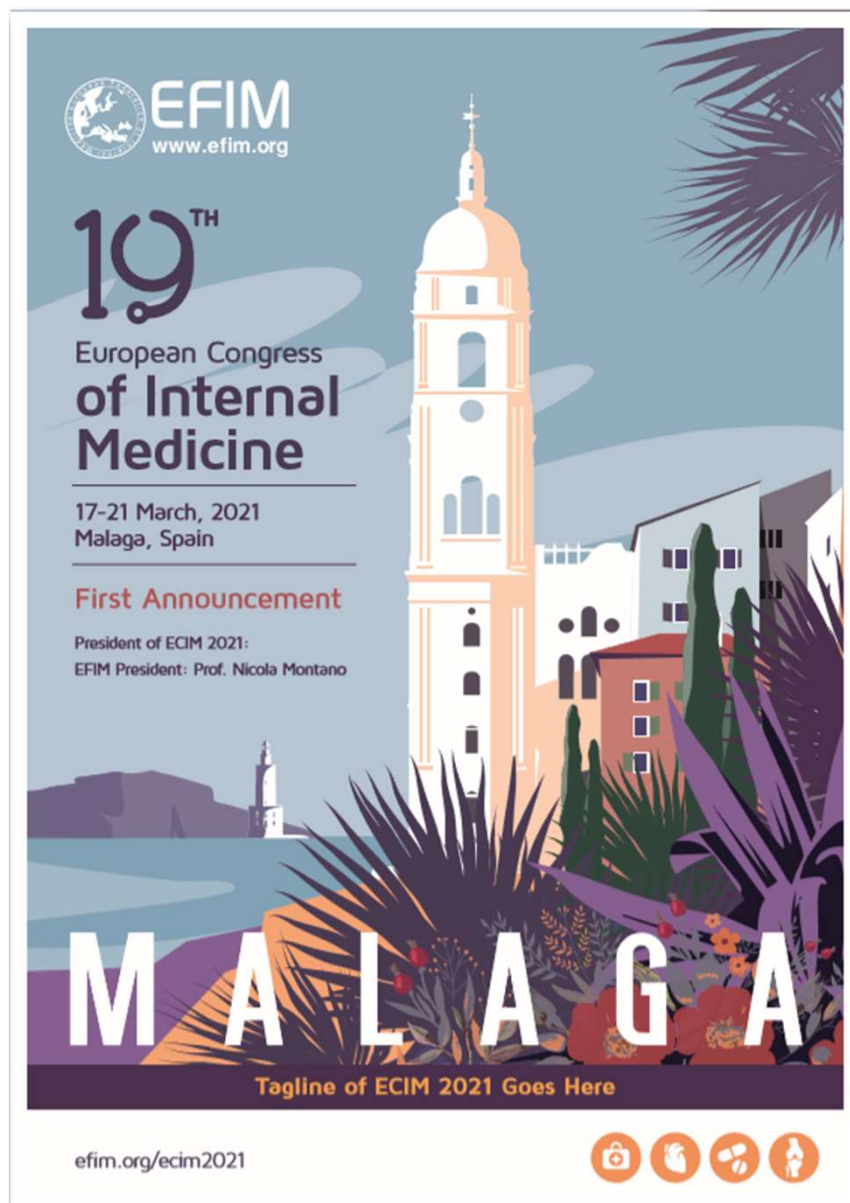
